What does God, as Creator, tell us about Him?

- 1) God is **Sovereign**. (Isaiah 46 :8-10)
- 2) God is **Other**. (Ex 15:11, Mal. 3 :6, I Tim 6:15b-16)
- 3) God is **Eternal**. (Gen. 21:33, Psalm 90:2)
- 4) God is **Knowable**. (Romans 1:19-20)

What must be our response to the Creator God?

- 1) **Humility**. (Isaiah 40:15-25)
- 2) **Fear**. (Romans 1:19-32)
- 3) **Praise**. (Psalm 136:4-9; 148:5, Rev. 4:11)
- 4) **Trust**. (Acts 15:18 NKJV)
 - We see this in the prayers of the saints in times of trouble. (Acts 4:24, II Kings 19:15, Jer. 32:17)
 - We see God reminding His people to trust Him. (Isaiah 40:25-29)
- 5) **Obedience**. (Romans 1:18-32)

26 Q Wherein did Christ's humiliation consist?
